

Theresa Wicklin Gillespie, PhD, RN

Theresa Gillespie is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Surgery and in the Winship Cancer Institute of Emory University School of Medicine, and Clinical Associate Professor, Nell Hodgson Woodruff School of Nursing at Emory. She has served as principal investigator for research grants funded by the National Cancer Institute, the National Blood Foundation, the Department of Veterans Affairs, and national Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Dr. Gillespie teaches graduate and undergraduate nursing students, medical students, residents and fellows. At the Atlanta VA Medical Center she provides clinical care in hematology-oncology and serves as Director of the Division of Health Services Research. For 18 years she directed oncology clinical trials in both community and academic settings and previously served as Associate Director for the Winship Cancer Center at Emory. Her research interests include patient and clinical decision-making, evidence-based guidelines, outcomes research, and trials of novel therapies against cancer and treatment toxicities. Dr. Gillespie holds a B.A. degree in Communication Studies and a Master's degree in Health Education from the University of Florida; and a BSN in Nursing and a PhD in Educational Studies and Research Methodology from Emory University. She has published extensively, is a frequent speaker on topics related to cancer research, treatment and supportive care and has served on the national review panel for the Department of Defense Cancer Research Programs. Dr. Gillespie was the 2005 recipient of the American Association for Cancer Research/Oncology Nursing Society Bench-to-Bedside Distinguished Lectureship sponsored by the National Cancer Institute.
